Research

As a research organisation, ATI carries out leading research in the fields of theatre studies and cultural policy. Research is financed from multiple sources and we have repeatedly managed to obtain support from national and international grants. ATI also draws on Institutional support for the Long-Term Conceptual Development of a Research Organisation (IP DKRVO). Ten research outputs from 2021 fell within the framework of IP DKRVO, while a further 5 were outside the remit of its financing and an additional three outputs come from a grant project financed by the Czech Science Foundation (GAČR).

Overview of Activities

DEPARTMENT OF COMMUNICATION AND MARKETING (OKAM)

OKAM provides communication campaigns, press service, PR for sub-activities, social media management, marketing tools and internal and external communications. In 2021, the number of followers for the FB page *Institut umění – Divadelní ústav* increased to 3,606 and the Instagram profile *jsme_idu* increased to 1,182 followers. Also in 2021, IDU continued its activities on responsible cultural organisations in the context of the climate crisis. Six episodes of the podcast Suflér, reflecting on necessities, visions and strategies in culture and the arts, were released throughout the year.

INSTITUTE OF ART (IU)

IU is a promotional, informational, educational, advisory and research centre, serving primarily the field of contemporary art. IU implements activities, projects and programmes that reflect the current needs of the contemporary art and culture sectors, thus contributing to their development and social status/prestige. IU works on a project basis, implementing the following activities, projects and programmes, which often overlap:

International presentations and collaborations, residencies

Four of the planned international residencies took place: two residencies for Czech artists at the Delfina Foundation in London, which had been postponed from 2020, and two residencies at the Czech Centre in Bucharest. A further three residencies for foreign artists in the Czech Republic took place (two in collaboration with MDP and one in collaboration with ESAC). Eight residencies at the Egon Schiele Art Centre in Český Krumlov went according to plan. ATI was a partner for the 10th Visegrad programme of writers' residencies. Projects from 6 organisations were supported as part of a programme for the support of events presenting contemporary Czech visual arts abroad.

Information Service and Platforms

Culturenet publishes and distributes newsletters and manages databases of cultural entities / projects / literature. In 2021, 51 newsletters were sent, with a total of about 4,000 news items. The number of website visits increased to 1,079,504 (an 8% increase compared to 2020). In 2021, we focused on updating the Directory section of the database and promoting the Library database.

The Creative Czechia (Kreativní Česko) platform focuses on raising awareness of the creative industries. In 2021, articles, interviews and reportage reflecting practical examples of support for the cultural and creative industries were published on the website. The zakreativnicesko.cz website was managed year round, promoting the sector as a whole and explaining the necessity of supporting it in the National Recovery Plan. A Creative Czechia meeting took place in September and was attended by 80 regional officials and politicians, along with representatives from the Ministry of Culture of the Czech Republic (MKČR).

ArtsCzech.cz publishes opportunities and news from Czech culture in English. CzechMobility.Info supports international and domestic artistic collaboration. SoundCzech has updated and streamlined its contact database/directory and expanded it to include the classical music circuit at soundczech.cz. SoundCzech has published an overview of current support opportunities for the music sector. Since 2010, the IU has been managing mezikulturnidialog.cz, a portal which provides information on events in the Czech Republic in areas such as the cultural activities of national minority organisations, the integration of foreigners into society, and inclusive education.

Professional growth

2021 marked the sixth year of the educational programme ATI Academy. The majority of participants were representatives of ten cultural organisations selected via an open call. At the end of the year, the Academy held a special workshop focused on strategic planning for cultural houses and centres and another event focused on evaluating the Academy's programme and promoting open calls for 2022.

Research

Activities in 2021 were carried out in accordance with the research concept for the field of cultural policy for 2019–2023; tasks included: mapping the state, structure, conditions, financing and needs of the arts and the social status of artists in the Czech Republic. In 2021, the research produced the following publications: *Mapping Methodology for Independent Theatre*, *Czech Dance in Data:* 6 / Dancers in Musicals, and Czech Dance in Data: 7/ Folk Dance.

With professional expertise, IU specialists provided consultations and participated in various events, such as the evaluation of the Ministry of Industry and Trade (MPO) and MKČR COVID calls, preparation of the implementation of the National Recovery Plan in the section on Artist Status, implementation of calls within the EEA and Norway Funds and the Suffér and Creative Czech podcast series.

SOUNDCZECH (SC)

As part of its support programmes, the pro-export music office SC supported: five showcase festivals/conferences as part of the Links In programme; the production of videos for nine music artists

as part of the PromoVideo programme; and nine educational projects for 15 music artists as part of the Connect/Create programme's Skills and Joint Cross-Border Creation programme.

CZECH MUSIC COUNCIL (ČHR)

The ČHR actively participated in regular EHR international meetings in discussions on the impact of Covid 19 and current measures (European Music Forum on Music), data collection, and online international conferences on the labour market and education. The ČHR organised an international ZOOM conference in collaboration with PEARLE, EAC, HAMU and JAMU titled Career of Musician – Does the Education System Correspond to the Labour Market? In the Czech Republic, the Council actively contributed to professional forums and round tables. The Council commented on strategic documents from the MKČR and the administration of the capital city of Prague (MHMP).

DEPARTMENT OF INTERNATIONAL COOPERATION (OMS)

OMS activities as part of the Promotion of Czech Performing Arts Abroad programme, presentation of the CR at international performing arts trade fairs and festivals and on the agendas international NGOs and networks (AICT, ASSITEJ, OISTAT, ITI, UNIMA, IETM and PACE.V4) took place in online, live and/or hybrid formats due to the SARS-CoV-19 pandemic. As the umbrella platform for Czech performing arts, the Czech ITI centre has been dealing with cultural and political topics and conditions for the performing arts throughout the year. Among other things, this agenda included the conference Kultura volí dialog (Culture Chooses Dialogue), organised at the Academy of Performing Arts in Prague (HAMU) and the Senate of the Parliament of the CR. OMS continued its ShowOff cycle of international discussions addressing current challenges faced by the field of performing arts, including the publication of ten podcast episodes. Despite pandemic restrictions, the 9th edition of Theatre Night was held live and 100 representatives of Czech arts were supported through the Go and See short-term mobility programme, which was extended to support individuals' promotional materials. OMS also provided informational services abroad through the portals and social networks www.PerformCzech.cz and www.performingartsV4.eu and continued projects supported by Creative Europe: ASSET, Create to Connect -> Create to Impact and RESHAPE. As part of its research and publication activities, OMS organised an international conference devoted to the 100th anniversary of the premiere of the play R.U.R. and published three publications, while the publication Divadlo a svoboda: První dekáda nezávislosti českého divadla po roce 1989 (Theatre and Freedom: The First Decade of Independent Czech Theatre After 1989) is the result of institutional research.

THEATRE INSTITUTE (DÚ)

The implementation of research projects dealing with theatre history continued in 2021. A key output is the online Czech Theatre Encyclopaedia. The most significant achievements in this area include the ongoing digitisation of the documentation archive: a total of 52,248 productions have been processed, covering over 800,000 digitised pages, 432,697 photographs (an increase of 23,529) and 54,152 stage and costume designs (an increase of 1,712). Delivery of the Orální historie českého divadla (Oral History of Czech Theatre) project continued; as of the end of 2021, we have completed exactly one hundred recorded interviews. We focused on connecting our databases with the Wikidata platform, and extended these activities to the international field, where we coordinate a pilot project of six organisations under the auspices of the international ENICPA network. Connection with the eduld federation is an important source of support for the further development of the organisation, which allows both employees and registered researchers remote access to digitised resources in Czech libraries, incl. so-called works not available on the market.

Information and documentation department

In 2021, the internal database *Divadlo* (Theatre) the Productions collection was expanded by 724 premieres (many of which, however, did not take place or were postponed to the next year due to anti-covid measures) and 174 records of older productions. In the Theatre Events, Festivals and Guest Performances collection, a further 175 festivals, 58 trips abroad, 19 performances by foreign ensembles, 29 exhibitions and 67 other events (lectures, awards, conferences, etc.) were included as part of the completion of current and retrospective events. 400 envelopes with information about 1,500 events were newly digitised. 640 new productions and programmes were added to the collection of the Video Library. Materials relating to a further 170 personalities from the People in Theatre collection were scanned.. 14 new recordings were made as part of the *Orální historie* project.

Library

The ATI Library has a unique collection of Czech and foriegn professional theatre literature, dramatic texts and literature from related fields, including professional, academic and cultural periodicals. With about 126,000 volumes, it is one of the largest libraries of its kind in Europe. The presentation of digitised documents on the internet is via the Kramerius system and the Digital Library of the Portaro catalogue. Number of registered readers: 8864. Number of additions to the library's collection in 2021: 4,046 As a member of SIBMAS, the ATI Library coordinates the activities of its 27 members and serves as the secretariat for the national organisation SIBMAS.

Bibliography department

The department manages an electronic database that serves as bibliographie of articles. As of the end of 2021, it contains 366,000 records about Czech and world theatre from Czech and foreign periodicals. At the end of 2021, about 150 titles of Czech printed and electronic newspapers and magazines and about 100 titles of foreign periodicals have been extracted. The department actively collaborates with the National Library of the Czech Republic, creating name authority files and contributing to the ANL catalogue.

Department of Collections and Archives (OSA)

OSA's primary activity is to acquire, preserve and present collections and archival artefacts and documents related to theatre, especially in the Czech territory. In 2021, OSA digitised and added almost 25,000 theatrical photographs and over 2,000 scenographic works to the Virtual Study Room. Costumes designed by Jana Preková, models by Iva Němcová, the estates of costume designer Jan Růžička, and journalist and theatre scholar Danuš Paseková and diaries by actress Zorka Janů were newly acquired for the collection.

Czech Theatre Studies Department (KČD)

The lexicographic project Česká divadelní encyklopedie (Czech Theatre Encyclopaedia) is KČD's long term project. In 2021, another 21 entries were published on the ČDE website and further entries from the new section, Činohra 1945-1989 (Dramatic Theatre 1945-1989) are about to be published. In addition to its publication activities and participation in conferences, KČD also deals with the two GAČR grant projects: *Podvod Allamody* (extended by 6 months) and the new project *Spaßmacher: Laik a/nebo profesionál? Divadlo v prostředí české šlechty ve druhé polovině 17. století* (Spaßmacher: Layman and/or Professional? Theatre in the Czech Nobility in the Second Half of the 17th Century). In collaboration with the ATI library, the KČD took over and organised Adolf Scherl's archive and library. KČD also organises the Theatre Research Society's regular lectures.

Publishing Department (EO)

The Publishing Department publishes original and translated works from the fields of theatre history, theory and criticism in the *Czech Theatre* (which includes the series *Essays*, *Criticism* and *Analyses*) and *World Theatre* series but also outside of them. It also publishes two series of dramatic texts: *Plays* and *Contemporary Plays*.

PRAGUE QUADRIENNAL OF PERFORMANCE DESIGN AND SPACE (PQ)

The project "Emergence: From Shared Experience to New Creativity" ended in June. During the summer, final reports were prepared, submitted and approved by the EACEA. The project was thus closed. At the same time, a new grant application was submitted for the continuation of this project (again with Creative Europe). The Canon of Technical Theatre History project continued as part of the Erasmus+ programme, with a partnership meeting held in the Czech Republic in October. Preparations were underway for another edition of PQ, which was officially announced in June. As of 31 October, open calls for all PQ 2023 projects have been published and the first round of selections for Czech representation in the main PQ 2023 exhibition took place.

CREATIVE EUROPE - CULTURE OFFICE

The year 2021, the first year of the new financial framework for the Creative Europe programme, was devoted to summarising the previous seven-year financial period; the second half of the year then saw the presentation of the new program via series of webinars, followed by consultations and a course for applicants. As a result of the pandemic, some activities had to be moved online or cancelled. Ongoing

work on the new website continued. At the beginning of the year, the Culture Office was involved in the #zakreativnicesko campaign. Ongoing cooperation continued with candidate cities preparing an application for the ECOC 2028 title. Organisation of events: Centre of interest: COVID as an Opportunity and Centre of Interest: Women's Power and Culture.
